Area of learning	Task
PSED	Can you take turns on a simple family game?
Physical development	Disco dough: Can you choose and name your colour playdough? (information below) Outside: Can you roll / kick / throw a ball

<p>Communication and Language</p>	<p>Can you name animals? Can you copy the animal sounds? Can you go on a 'I see' walk? Can you name colours?</p>
<p>Literacy</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you develop early mark making skills using animals in different textures such as rice or sand to make lines and circles? • Can you draw a picture of the animals and write captions? • Phonics: can you listen to animal sounds and name the animal (phonics play and letters and sounds websites)
<p>Mathematics</p>	<p>Can you sort by colour? Can you find the odd one out and say which doesn't belong?</p>
<p>Understanding the world</p>	<p>Can you see any animals in your garden or daily walk? (bees, birds, dogs etc). Can you count how many?</p>
<p>Expressive arts</p>	<p>Can you paint animals from the story? Or make marks on pictures from the story? Can you play with small world animals or pretend to be an animal? Can you paint a rainbow / chalk rainbows outside</p>

Outdoor learning / sensory ideas		
Water play – sea animals	Make different animals using playdough	Add food colouring to water to change the colour
Threading beads of different colours – if you don't have beads use pasta	If you have paints – do hand prints / foot prints or make marks using different colours outside	Cook and dye spaghetti or pasta different colours and explore in a sensory tray
Make animals from construction: lego, duplo and junk modelling (cereal boxes, yoghurt pots etc)	Hide animal toys in the garden – can you find them?	Collect stones or pebbles from your garden or walk and paint / chalk different colours
