Area of learning	Task
PSED	Can you draw a happy face and a sad face and match it to how the characters are feeling throughout the story?
Physical development	Can you move like different animals – run, crawl, jump, fly, slither? Can you use tweezers to transfer woodland objects into pots?
Communication and language	Retell the story – through labelling the characters or commenting/sequencing what happens using pictures/toys. What's gone? – have 2+ objects on show, cover them up and take one away, can you identify what has gone?
Literacy	Can you develop early mark making skills using your finger or brush in sensory things such as paint, shaving foam, flour to make lines and circles? Can you write a label/caption/sentence about the story?
Numeracy	Count the woodland objects you have collected (pine cones, twigs, leaves etc), match to or write the number Comparing size – can you sort into big/small or compare and order objects such as teddies, sticks, leaves, cars etc
Expressive art and design	Paint/draw (felt tips) owls onto stones, set up a woodland scene and retell the story
Understanding the world	Can you make a bird feeder for your garden – here is a link to help https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/simple-bird-feeder-craft-instructions-t-tp-7309 Owls are awake at night, can you make an owl shadow puppet? You could have lots of fun in a darkened room with a torch and your shadow puppet

<u>Outdoor learning/sensory ideas</u>		
Make a shoebox nest using twigs, sticks, grass, use cotton wool to represent the feathers	Look for birds on your walks	Make marks in the soil/sand using sticks
Make owls and trees out of playdoh		Do some tree rubbings
