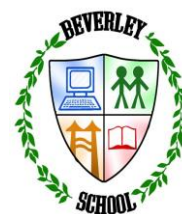

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Dear parents / carers,

Thank you for your continued support in getting all students back into school safely over the past month. All of us are committed to providing the best education possible for your child, while securing the health and safety of our whole school community. School reopenings	<i>Full timetable- all students attending</i>
Attendance	<i>Attendance figures for first full week of term :93.3% (March 2-6th 2020 91.9%)</i>
Coverage of the curriculum	<i>Full curriculum except for swimming</i>
Remote learning March - July 2020	<i>Work provided on a class or Phase basis and responsive to individual requests. Work was a mixture of paper-based and online.</i>
Remote learning in the future	<i>Flow chart showing procedure shared with parents. For a single pupil going into self-isolation and awaiting or received test results or quarantining. After 48hrs a phone call to check how pupil is and as to whether they are well enough to be able to work at home. Work provided by CT on an individual needs basis. In case of full class isolation, project based work pack and online learning provided. Weekly phonecall to be made by CT.</i>
Mental health and wellbeing	<i>Kooth website shared with older pupils. Weekly wellbeing phone call if self-isolating/quarantining. FLO providing support for parents.</i>
