Students vary in their developmental stage at each age related Key stage at Beverley and so will access provision at a point when they are developmentally ready, cognitively, socially and emotionally as they progress through EYFS—KS2 in Primary.

<p>EYFS students will have access to social , communication and independence skills as a prerequisite to preparation for Adulthood and employability skills :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Real world play (kitchens, DIY, cleaning builder / nurse / doctor) • Making choices -Using visual timetables and choice boards to help express needs. • Adapting to new environments • Playing with other children • Awareness of own (and others) feelings. • Adult led supported strategies to manage routine, cope with difficulties and stay calm. • Social stories to help with difficult situations 	<p>KS1 provision will increase to include access to preparation for Adulthood and employability skills via:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Role play home corner • Experiencing going out of school as a group and travelling on mini bus/train • Real world visits (fire stations, farms etc.) • 'What do you want to be when you grow up?' - role play • Meeting job related role models—visitors to school • Understanding own and others feelings. - explore or experience jobs and careers through a range of real world visits
- participate in sessions from visitors on job roles, careers and future aspirations
- talk about different careers and education options.
